Notice to Voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See end of ballot for initials.)

IMPORTANT: It is recommended to use an official ballot marking pen available at your polling place or a #2 pencil.

Instructions to Voters

If you make a mistake on your ballot or have a question, ask an election inspector for help. (Absentee voters: Contact your municipal clerk.)

To vote for a name on the ballot, complete the arrow next to the name like this

RESOLUTION TO EXCEED REVENUE CAP COMMENCING WITH THE 2019-20 SCHOOL YEAR

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of Osceola, Polk and St. Croix Counties, Wisconsin, that the final school district budget shall include the amounts set forth below in excess of the revenue limits imposed by Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes each year for a period of four years on a non-recurring basis for the purpose of supporting each child's success and providing a safe environment by supporting District operation costs including curriculum, utilities, educational programming, technology, and transportation as follows: \$1,500,000 for the 2019-20 school year, \$1,750,000 for the 2020-21 school year, \$2,225,000 for the 2021-22 school year and \$2,750,000 for the 2022-23 school year.

Shall the School Board of the School District of Osceola be authorized to exceed the revenue limit under Section 121.91 of the Wisconsin Statutes beginning with the 2019-20 school year on a non-recurring basis over a period of four years by the amounts set forth below for the purpose of supporting each child's success and providing a safe environment by supporting District operation costs including curriculum, utilities, educational programming, technology, and transportation as follows: \$1,500,000 for the 2019-20 school year, \$1,750,000 for the 2020-21 school year, \$2,225,000 for the 2021-22 school year and \$2,750,000 for the 2022-23 school year as provided in the foregoing resolution?
