

VOTER REGISTRATION

Who is Eligible to Vote?

- A United States Citizen and at least 18 years of age on Election Day.
- A resident of the Town of Osceola for at least 10 days prior to an election.

How do I Register to Vote?

You may register to vote in the Clerk's office until 5:00 p.m. the Friday before the election or on Election Day. You must reside at your address for 10 consecutive days to be eligible to vote, and you may no longer use a corroborating witness as proof of residence. Proof of residence is required when registering to vote.

I'm Already Registered Elsewhere.

Your registration cannot be transferred from another municipality. A new registration in the Town of Osceola is required. You will be asked to fill out Form EL-131 so that your prior registration can be cancelled.

What if I've Moved Within the Town of Osceola or Have Changed My Name?

Additionally, if you have changed your name with the Department of Transportation and/or Social Security Administration, you will need to re-register. This is done by filling out a Wisconsin Voter Registration Form (EL-131), located on the Town's website under Election Info. Send form to the Clerk-Treasurer's office or complete the form in the Clerk-Treasurers office before or on Election Day. Please remember that there is no voter registration the Monday prior to Election Day.

Please bring proof of your new name or address.

Forms of Proof of Residence:

These documents constitute proof of residence if they are valid on the day used if they:

- Contain the voter's current and complete first and last name and
 - Contain the current and complete residential address, including a numbered street address.
1. A current and valid Wisconsin driver's license.
 2. A current and valid Wisconsin identification card.
 3. Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
 4. Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.

5. A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
6. A residential lease which is effective for a period that includes Election Day (NOT for first-time voters registering by mail).
7. A university, college or technical institute fee card (must include photo).
8. A university, college or technical institute identification card (must include photo).
9. A gas, electric or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing not earlier than 90 days before Election Day.
10. Bank statement.
11. Paycheck.
12. A check or other document issued by a unit of government.
